Fall Irrigation Changes. Cool fall mornings have signaled that it is time once again to change our irrigation controllers to Southern Nevada Water Authority's (SNWA) mandatory fall schedule. SNWA reminds all customers that it's time to scale back irrigation and eliminate water waste by reducing irrigation days to just three days


a week.

Most Southern Highlands' residence fall into SNWA's Group B, which restricts watering to Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays until October 31st. Watering with a handheld hose or supervised testing of your irrigation is allowed any time. No irrigation is permitted on Sundays. Watering on days other than your assigned day may be considered water waste and result in a SNWA fee. Failing to fix an irrigation repair causing water waste may also result in a SNWA fee.

New Sports Park Opens to Eager Crowds

On August 28th, County Commissioner Susan Brager joined Southern Highlands' Developer, Garry Goett, in cutting the ribbon to open Southern Highlands' newest park, Olympia Sports Park. The 17-acre park is located at 4855



Starr Hills Avenue (across the street from Stuckey Elementary) and offers some spectacular views of the city from its hilltop peak. The park amenities include six basketball courts; three full-size, lighted multipurpose fields for soccer, flag and frisbee football, lacrosse, and other sports; two playgrounds with shade structures; a splash pad; restrooms, and a hillside walking trail with workout stations and picnic tables.

Approximately 300 residents attended the grand opening ceremony and nearby residents have kept the park's foot traffic constant since its opening. The fields have quickly become popular sites for team practices. The two age-specific playsets are busy all day, and the walk path is extremely popular in the morning and evening hours when gorgeous sunrises and sunsets paint the horizon. At nearly any hour, you'll find the park busy with activity; but the hillside trail seems to be the most magnetic. From



workout enthusiasts pushing their limits on the trail's bodyweight training stations to dog walkers enjoying a desert stroll, this trail is never idle.

The layout and content of the park show the thought put into its design. The desert plants used to landscape the hillside are all labeled so residents can identity their favor-

Here are 10 tips to host your best garage sale:

 While deciding what you want to sell, remember if you bought it and it's in good shape, someone else will probably want to buy it as well.



Prominently display large furniture items

- Price your items individually with price tags because items may be picked up and moved around throughout the day. Try not to sell things for less than a dollar because it can be difficult to provide proper change; instead, group smaller items together until they value a dollar.
- Organization and details are key to a garage sale's success. Little things like washing and hanging clothes or displaying furniture in view of the street make a big impact.
- 4. Don't be afraid to get artistic. Making posters, an easy and fun activity for the kids, can completely change your sales. Would you rather go to a boring garage or a festival of knickknacks?
- 5. If you want to sell to the garage

- sale's regulars to attend, you need to be ready at 7 am sharp! These early birds will move on to the next home if you are not prepared.
- Stay vigilant of people trying to take advantage of garage sales by not allowing people into your home. Barriers and signage will limit access to your home and parts of your garage.
- 7. Time to show off those sales skills. Be friendly and welcome people to your "shop". This will help in your awareness of who is in your garage and make buyers feel welcome.
- 8. Bargaining is a part of the garage sale game and something you will have to do. Keep it light, be patient and don't be afraid to say no. Bargaining skill



will come with practice.

- 9. Bulk buys are not just for Costco anymore. If you have a lot of a certain object, selling them together is an easy way to make sure you sell as much as possible without leftovers.

When It's Not Snow on Your Window Ledge

Pigeons are feral birds that find plenty of food, shelter, and protection from natural predators within urban communities. They bring with them diseases, mites, and other pests attracted to their droppings. These unwelcome house guests quickly produce large amounts of waste that can pose health risks to family members. Once they move into a home, they're very difficult to eradicate. Here are a few suggestions to encourage these pigeons to take flight and find a more suitable place to live.

- Eliminate uncovered food sources such as trash receptacles and outdoor pet food dishes.
- Pick up after pets regularly because pigeons will eat pet waste.
- ♦ Cover trash containers and keep areas

- around containers clean.
- Enclose the openings of vents, attics, eaves, and around air conditioning units with screen material.
- Fit flat surfaces at roof edges with beveled wood or concealed metal spikes to deter roosting.
- Promptly remove rebuilt nests to encourage pigeons to move on.



- Perch an artificial predator such as a hawk, owl, snake or cat in the area where pigeons congregate and move it frequently.
- ♦ Consider contacting a professional when the infestation is large. These experts can safely remove the waste and treat the area to discourage re-infestation. Be prepared, the eradication process may require a few different layers of deterrents
